Planners Review Parking Ordinance

City planners Wednesday night stepped closer to a city ordinance to create a new land use classification for parking.

The plan board has long sought a specific zone for parking. Under the present zoning ordinance land used for parking must be zoned for business.

Properly changed to a business zoning for the express purpose of parking cars under the present ordinance, be used for any commercial development that the business zoning will allow.

PLANNERS REVIEWED the proposed parking ordinance step-by-step, strengthening the ordinance wherever they found a question of future enforcement problems, and streamlining the entire regulation to make the law as modern as possible.

The ordinance was submitted to the board by Planning Technician Robert Boatman who will revise the wording and submit it to the board for final approval before it is recommended to the city commission.

The ordinance would call for two types of parking regulations. One classification would regulate parking areas in the business area; the second would outline restrictions on parking in residential areas.
