## Earmark Funds For Improvement Of Park Sites

Residents of the Poppleton Park area Monday night asked Birmingham city commissioners to explain their future plans of development. "We know it's going to be developed," a spokesman for the group said, "but would like to know exactly what is planned." Mayor Dean Beier told the group it was the city's aim to make the best use possible of the area with the least detriment to the residential sections around it. "The idea has been pretty well publicized," Beier explained, "and residents are welcome to go to the recreation board to examine the complete mock-up which has been made of the park." He also suggested that if area residents had any further questions, they might ask for a meeting with the city's recreation board. The group was assured that adequate off-street parking plans for the recreation area would work no hardship on residential streets.

slide there, stating that there are not enough hills in the city to provide a safe slide for children. "It could be done at almost no cost," he explained, "by creating a mound by dumping rubbish there, then covering it with top soil." Installation of drinking fountains at Harmon, St. James and Pembroke Parks was approved, along with other improvements. AN ALLOCATION of \$200 was made for Harmon to include the fountain and any additional grading required for the baseball diamond. At Pembroke Park an allotment of \$100 was earmarked for the fountain, while at St. James, \$470 was approved for the fountain and to cover the \$233.04 deficiency in the improvement program funds. Commenting on the fountain installations, Commissioner Main said, "We've got several fountains in other parks and we can't seem to get any of them to work. It seems to me that if we're going to put them in, we should keep them in working order."

## OTHER PARK plans coming before Birmingham commissioners included the appropriation of \$3,000 for the development of a ball diamond at Eton park and a tree planting program around the periphery of the park this fall. Commissioner Ralph Main suggested the erection of a totem pole
