

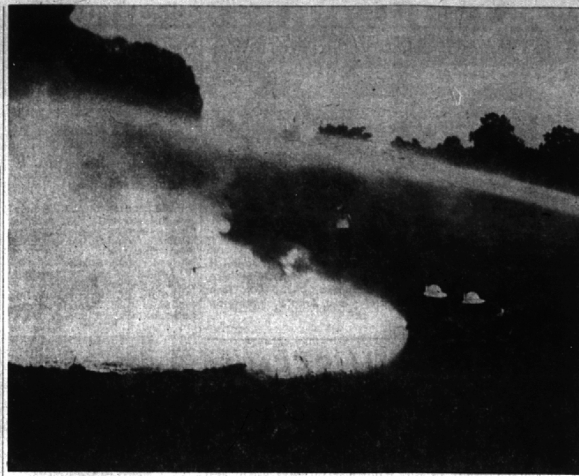

City to Seek Rouge Valley Sewage Dist.

The city of Birmingham, pressed for greater sewage disposal facilities, gave the "go ahead" sign to a second proposal to ease the sewage problem when the city commission Monday night passed a resolution calling for further study of a Rouge Valley sewage disposal district.

The commission already has approved tentative steps to join the Southeastern Oakland County disposal district to dispose of sewage from the east side of the city.

The Rouge Valley Authority, if agreed upon by all concerned, would be a joint effort of the City of Bloomfield Hills, Troy township, Bloomfield township and Birmingham to prevent further pollution of the Rouge River.

Birmingham will be represented at a meeting called by the Water Resources Commission at Haven Hill, June 24, to express the city's desire for such an authority.
