Police Explain Laws Concerning Young Drivers

"Parents who permit their children to drive a car without obtaining a license are held liable."
 Police Chief Ralph W. Moxley made that statement this week after it had come to his attention that a number of parents are under the impression that children may drive without a license if under adult supervision.
 "These people are wrong under a wrong impression," Moxley said. "The owner of a car is liable to a fine for permitting its use to drive without a license. Furthermore, a boy or girl cannot obtain a license until they are fourteen. Letting a person drive who has never obtained a license, also is asking for a fine."
 Moxley explained that beginners' permits could be issued to boys and girls who have reached their 14th birthday, under certain specified conditions.

THE LACK of adequate transportation to and from school or the need for a youngster to assist parents in business are the two main reasons for which these "junior" licenses are issued. To obtain one, the 14-year-old must have satisfactorily completed a driver training course.
 These young drivers are permitted to use public highways only between 5 a.m. and 7 p.m., and for the reasons specified in the license. They must be under adult supervision at all times.
 Chief Moxley said full information on beginner permits could be obtained at police headquarters.

"WE'VE HAD one lucky escape for young drivers in Birmingham," he said. "It was just pure luck, too, that no other car was involved in that crash and the none of the five boys were killed."
 "This is plainly a case of parental guidance being the only way to successfully curb it. The police cannot possibly check every boy and girl in town, we must depend on fathers and mothers to cooperate with us."
 "We feel that for the safety of their children, they will be more willing to work with us. We're not only that they are liable prohibit children under 14 to drive, and to see to it that the older children do not have access to the family car until they have passed their driver training course and are properly licensed."
