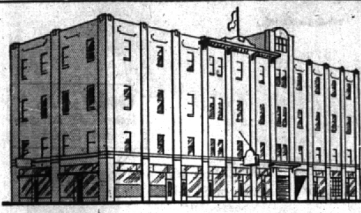

Spring Housecleaning And Fire Prevention

Spring housecleaning time presents a wonderful opportunity to remove from the home many combustible items such as those paper piles of rags and other obnoxious material that is in many cases the source of serious fires.

Most fires of a serious nature start either in the attic or in the basement of homes where discarded material such as mentioned above is stored or kept.

They offer the ideal source for origin of fire, because they have a very low kindling point and are in most cases loose and not stored in boxes or cases.

Most fires unless they result from ignition of flammable vapors, start and burn progressively. Light weight material such as rags and papers, is the first step of a progressively burning fire, and when they are removed, about 80 to 90 percent of the chance of home fires is removed.

THE MAIN objective of the fire prevention bureau in the City of Birmingham when inspecting business and industrial places is to have these low flash materials removed. This, we know from records, has in a very large way controlled damage by fire throughout the business and industrial areas of the city.

Why not be the fire prevention person in your home? Follow this first rule of good fire prevention in the home remove the material of the first stage of a progressively burning fire, things easily ignited by a cigarette, cigar or by just plain carelessness.

Remember, a little housecleaning now may save a big job of fire cleanup later.

Open House Eyed By YMCA

With the interior of the new temporary Birmingham YMCA completed by the North Woodward Building's Association and furnishings almost all in place on a drive sponsored by the Junior Chamber of Commerce, the Birmingham Y has just to complete its landscaping.
