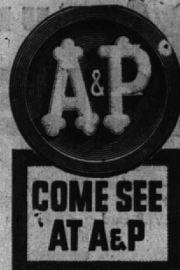

**GTWRR Rezoning Request Set For July 21 Hearing**

The Industrial Land Co. has asked the city commission to rezone the property between Eaton and the railroad right-of-way from single income dwellings to terrace dwellings. A previous petition to rezone from single income to business or multiple dwellings, has been reviewed by the city plan board after a meeting with affected property owners with the recommendation that it be denied. The new petition to rezone the terrace dwellings was presented by the Industrial Land Co. to the city commission Monday night. The petition stated that the company was having difficulty renting or selling single income homes because of the railroad and it asked that it be allowed to build terraces like the Graefield which lie just north of the property.

**A HEARING** has been set for July 21 to study the request and to decide on the petition. The owner of lot 38, Townsend and Chester Castle-addition, requested the city commission, to rezone this property to permit the construction of professional office buildings.

**Fireworks Can Be Legal, Says Chief**

Fireworks have always been associated with the Fourth as long as most folks can remember. The only drawback is that under Act 148 of the State Law most of the noisemakers are illegal. Chief Vern W. Griffith has reminded folks that legal fireworks can still be obtained but there are certain steps that must be taken. The only way that fireworks displays may be given in Michigan is by special permit. Rules which govern the granting of these permits contain these clauses: The granting of this permit enables the person to order and receive by public carrier the types of fireworks he desires. Railway Express and other carriers will not transport fireworks without this permit. This does not include small caps and sparklers. It does, however, govern the explosive content of these items. Chief Griffith urges that all parents take extra precautions to keep their children safe from any misuse of fireworks. He also stated the safest way to enjoy fireworks is by watching a public display run by a competent operator. He stressed that it was not worth the enjoyment of watching illegal fireworks if injury and property damage prevail.
