**Students Learn Rules of the Road In Driving Class**

Hold your temper. The little lady at the wheel of the car that best you to the parking place may be a graduate of a driver's training class and may well have the right of way.

The interest shown by girls at the Birmingham high school for the driving course has prompted school officials to believe that this course should stay in the school curriculum.

The young ladies have taken to the wheel in an attempt to stamp out all standing jokes about women drivers, and according to their instructor, Lewis Parry, the results have been impressive.

Only three boys answered the toll call for the last semester's class but 24 girls expressed their desire to be good drivers.

Parry has been schooling the students in laws of the road and actual experience on the road for the past year in Birmingham. He taught the same course for two years at Holding high school, Holding Mich., prior to joining the Birmingham school system.

Students receive 20 hours of classroom work that covers safety practices, responsibility of the motorist, diagram sketches of automobile operation, and simple mechanics.

Each student is tested for eyesight, reaction time, judgment of distance and night driving reactions.

Then the student is taken on the road for eight hours of actual driving experience before qualifying for an Automobile Association of America certificate.

Parry, praising the work of the last semester students, said, "Once a student learns to relax, there is no problem in teaching them the fundamentals of good driving."
