Mental Patients Are Being Aided By Floral Work

An appeal for assistance in being made this week by Alice Westcott Burlingame, 319 Glenhurst, to the people of Birmingham to help patients at the Pontiac mental hospital.

Mrs. Burlingame, gardening authority and writer of "Down to Earth" which appears weekly in The Birmingham Eccecmtric, is especially among the older people with whom she is working. "The chance to do something creative and work with their hands is their chief interest, in things that give them their energies and the outlet for their energies supply them with an incentive for work."

"WE ARE FACING one problem at present, though. Since a great many of these people lack muscular coordination, flower containers are broken quite rapidly. I hate the thought of denying them the simple pleasure they get from working with flowers, as well as the help they get from the work. But, we must have more containers if our floral arrangement program is to continue. "I wonder, if perhaps some of our Birmingham residents can help us out? I know in my own home there have been several cases which I no longer use. "A chip or two does not matter for it is mainly the lack of having something to do with their hands and the fragrance and color of the blooms which fascinates the group. They are not critical of the containers."

"IF ANYONE has stored containers in basement, attic or garage, and no longer has use for them, they would be most gratefully received. I am taking the liberty of asking that they leave such containers at my home so I may turn them over to the group in Pontiac for our classes."

Mrs. Burlingame stresses that all types and all colors can find a place in the program.
