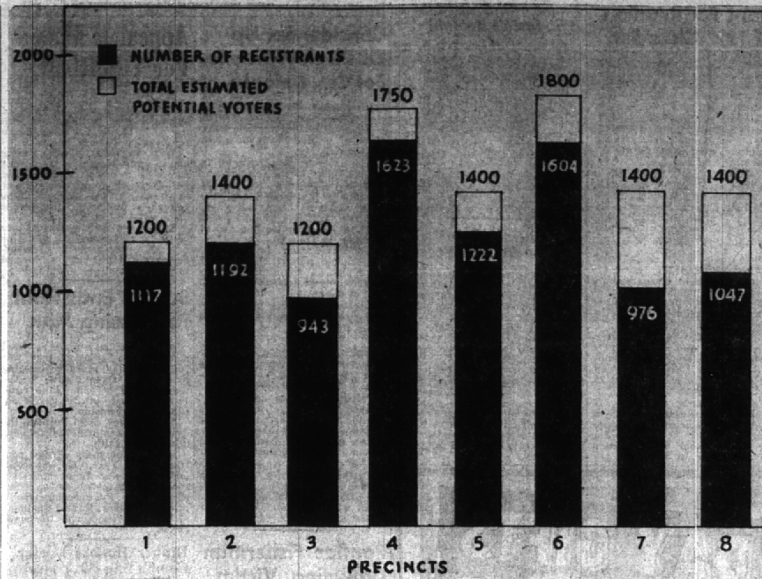

Library To Ask For More Funds

The Baldwin Public Library board will meet with city commissioners Monday night at the regular commission meeting to discuss ways and means of raising an additional \$18,845 for the next fiscal year's budget of the library.
 The city allotted \$41,154 for the library that fell short of the \$66,000 asked by the board to meet expenses and gain needed improvements.
 The board is considering asking voters next year to amend the city charter to permit more than one mill to be levied for support of the library.
 Meanwhile, the board is expected to ask the city to take from its capital improvement fund the balance of next year's financial needs of the library.

Chairman Richard C. Van Dusen. "The individual who was 'too busy to register' or who didn't bother to do so because he thought his vote didn't count, would do well to reflect on the 1950 gubernatorial election," said Van Dusen. "A margin of less than 1,200 votes has kept Gov. Williams in office for the last two years," he said.
 "There are 1,776 otherwise eligible voters in Birmingham alone who can't vote because they aren't registered," Van Dusen continued. "That is more than one and one-half times as many votes that would have been required to change the result of the 1950 election throughout Michigan."
 "THEIR VOTES" would have counted. That's why the Birmingham Republican committee has adopted the slogan, "It's your vote that counts."

The accompanying graph, showing Miss Hanley's actual registered voter figure and the committee's careful estimate of voting strength in each of the city's precincts, is "self explanatory," said Van Dusen.
 The committee cites differences between potential voters and actual votes in two major elections to back its drive to get men and women registered.
 In 1948, "a critical year politically," said Van Dusen, "there were too many Republicans who thought their votes didn't count."
 There were 7,584 registered voters in Birmingham in 1948. Only 6,331 voted, and there is no count of the non-registered voters who never thought about their ballot.
 IN 1950, when Williams was re-elected, there were 9,112 registered voters, and only 6,699 voted. Again, there was no count of non-registered voters.
 By April, 1952, according to Miss Hanley, there were 9,437 registered voters. On May 26, at latest count, there were 9,724.
 But, as the graph indicates, there are at least 13,500 men and women over 21 who are capable of voting, but 1,776 haven't registered and until they do, they cannot vote.
