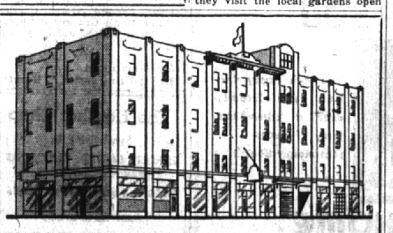
Of Local Interest
