Let's Re-tackle Our Local Parking Problem

Perhaps one of the most important current problems facing everybody in Birmingham is that of finding and placing in operation suitable parking facilities for the downtown shopping area. While this problem has been presented to the com-munity before, it did not receive many believe offi-

While this problem has been presented to the community before, it did not receive, many believe, sufficient attention from all interested parties. It was tabled by a former city commission and now lies somewhere in that nebulous world of government known as "under consideration."

This is not to single out for criticism the city commission whose responsibility, after all, does not preclude other groups—for example, local business concerns and also residential taxpayers—from becoming a part of the machinery of decision regarding this pressing problem.

WE SHALL NOT ATTEMPT to trace for you all WE SHALL NOT ATTEMPT to trace for you all details of the recent investigation of off-street parking by a special committee of the Birmingham Plan Com-mission; of that committee's long work on the project; of various local meetings held here, under the auspices of the plan and city commissions; of the inability of the various interests to compromise their viewpoints to the end that some type of off-street parking project could be undertaken. could be undertaken.
You, no doubt, recall these various phases of the

situation.

Every day Birmingham's downtown parking prob-lem increases. Shoppers quite often find it difficult to park their cars within easy walking distance of stores they wisk to patronize. Local businessmen and women know this . . . yet fail to enlist themselves in whatever movement is necessary to protect their businesses against new out-of-Birmingham competition that most certainly will be developed . . . new business areas where plenty of parking space will entice the custom-ers' dollars.

FAILURE TO PROVIDE better parking facilities for Birmingham's existing business inevitably will result in other areas of business competition. It will bring about considerable inconvenience to shoppers who wish to patronize local merchants. It can, in the long run, result in a lowering of assessed tax valuations in the existing business area—a subject in which the whole community should be interested—for when tax reve-

community should be interested—for when tax revenues from a business section decrease, residential property assessments generally increase.

Summarizing the problem, do you not agree that:
(a) parking space is woofully lacking in the downtown shopping district; (b) it can be acquired only through the concerted and co-operative efforts of the through the concerted and co-operative efforts of the owners of local business properties that stand to be benefited, plus city officials who, after all, represent not only business taxpayers but the home-owners whose own lives are related to the convenience of the merchandise and services they require from the community in which they live.

With open minds, without prejudice, and in the spirit of community co-operation, let's immediately resume our efforts to solve this most important Birmingham problem!
