## Work of German Artist Has Two Local Showings

The artistic career of Hans Jaenisch, noted young German artist, is receiving particular emphasis in two local exhibitions of his work.

Three of his recent paintings are included in a show of contemporary German artists now at the Cranbrook Art Museum.

At Birmingham's Little Gallery Peggy deSalle has collected sixty drawings, water colors, and mixed technique pictures which illustrate the score of Jaenisch's work.

**THE EXHIBIT** at the Little Gallery falls into three categories. The first, a series of pastel water colors dated 1944-46, are representative of his pre-war style, reflecting the rather stylized and somewhat stilted presentations permitted by the Nazi rulers of art.

The second group, done while in the Africa Corps as an American prisoner of war, are almost entirely pen and ink drawings highlighted and enhanced by pure water color.

This group comprises the artist's reactions to North Africa and the southwestern United States, and are almost topographic in form. They vividly portray the ability of the artist to see, remember, and record irrespective of war or peace.

The third group is comprised of pastel, gouache and penna relief paintings dated 1947 to the present and are specifically of the contemporary school.
