Easter Seals Fund Drive 'Y' Membership Enrollment Off To Fast Start

Greater Detroit Hospital Fund or Woodward General Hospital will go toward construction of the ambulatory clinic. Cost of the clinic is being privately underwritten by the principals of the Bloomfield Medical Center.

An organizational meeting of the "Y" members in the Birmingham area was held Monday evening at the Dearborn Motors Corp. building. This area includes Birmingham, Bloomfield Hills, Bloomfield Village, Beverly Hills and Franklin.

2 Rewards Posted For Apprehension Of Dog Poisoner

Mrs. William G. Ferguson, West Valley road, Bloomfield Hills, head of the Oakland County Animal Welfare society, said this week two rewards had been posted for information leading to the conviction of the person or persons poisoning pets in the Bloomfield Hills area.

"The first report was received about a month ago," she said. "Two weeks ago dogs belonging to David Bradley and Max Pruhau families on Brookside drive were killed.

"In that instance meat containing pellets of a cyanide derivative were found in the vicinity.

"DURING the past weekend a golden retriever puppy owned by David Bradley and a spaniel from the Phillip Maxwell home died. Both families live on Barbour terrace.

Mrs. Ferguson said the county association had posted a \$50 reward, with an additional \$25 offered by the Michigan Anti-Cruelty society.

"We deeply appreciate any help the public can offer us and sincerely hope we are able to apprehend the guilty party," she added.

Accept Bids for School Additions in Southfield

Bids were accepted Monday evening by the Southfield School board for additions to the new high school and Magnolia elementary school.

Superintendent Glenn Schoenhals announced that the low bid, J. A. Fredman Co. of Pontiac, was awarded the construction contract for the 11-room high school addition. The bid was \$122,888.

OTHER BIDS accepted for the high school addition were J. D. Naylor and Son of Detroit, plumbing, heating and ventilating, \$34,907; and Yauch-Miller Electrical, Inc., electrical work, \$15,100.

Schoenhals said construction work on the high school addition is expected to get underway in 10 days.

De Mare Brothers bid of \$10,420 for construction of the Magnolia school one-room addition was accepted. The board also approved the \$1,343 plumbing, heating and ventilating bid from Naylor and Sons; and Yauch-Miller's bid of \$785 for electrical work.

In other school board business Monday, bids for three new school buses were received and the contract will be awarded in the next few weeks.

Will Reconsider Paving of Alley

It required five affirmative votes to pass because more than 20 percent of the abutting property owners objected to the paving.
