

Troy Host to 'C' Regionals

Troy high school this week again is host to a high school state tournament, as action starts in the Class C Regionals.

Play got underway Wednesday evening with Highland Park St. Benedict meeting Oxford and St. Gregory looking up with Sweetest Heart.

Thursday evening's competition will find Lakeshore facing Algonac at 7 p.m. and Keego Harbor against St. Paul at 8:30. Semi-final games are scheduled at 7 and 8:30 Friday with the final Saturday at 8 p.m.

Pre-tourney favorite is Detroit St. Gregory which won 17 and lost one the past season. Another strong aggregation is St. Clair Shores' Lakeshore which tied for the Bi-County title.

Bord Larson stated that doors will open at 6:15 each evening. The Troy gym has a seating capacity of 1300 with standing room for 200 additional persons.

Winner of this regional tourney will face the Saginaw center

champion in a quarter-final game the site and date to be announced later.

Over-all dimensions of the floor are 70 feet by 100. Playing floor size is 50 by 86 feet.

In the Class B and C district tourneys held at Troy last week Utica and Lakeshore were winners. During Saturday's finals, Utica defeated Mt. Clemens, St. Mary's 49-40, while Lakeshore won in Class C over Roseville Eastland 35-34 in an overtime tilt.

THE HOST TEAM, Troy was defeated Friday evening by St. Mary's 47-45. Troy at one time in the fourth quarter held a nine point lead but its margin steadily faded throughout the game's remainder.

Attendance for the four-day district tournament was approximately 3,500, according to Larson.

Troy high school is located on Livernos, just north of 10 Mile road.
