**Community Use of New High School Proposed**

All local residents, young and old alike should be given an opportunity to use the many facilities of the new Birmingham high school building when it is completed, Frank Whitney, city recreation director and athletic director of schools, said this week.

However, before any plan for community-wide use of the building and gymnasium is adopted, approval will have to be given by both the board of education and recreation board, Whitney emphasized.

He pointed out that it is only natural that a school which is built, paid for and supported by all should be used by all.

Under his plan, functional use of the new school provides for three main areas of activity which last from morning to 10 in the evening.

Whitney stated, "Traditional school needs are met during the first session of the day which ends at 3 p.m. This is followed by school community recreational events until 6 p.m. The third field of activity would begin at 7 p.m. and close at 10. It is at this time that the school truly becomes an educational and recreational unit of the community."

The director pointed out, "The primary purpose of the school building is to provide facilities for the education of children. For many years education was thought of in terms of the three R's. However, modern school curricula include many additional subjects and activities such as art, music, vocational classes, family living, physical education, varsity athletics, driver training and many others."

"WITH THE BROADENING of scope of the curriculum came new and improved building facilities and a new conception of public school education. Today, its function is to produce well-adjusted individuals who are capable of taking their place in our complex society."

"In other words, there has been a shifting of the center of attention from subject matter to the needs, interests and goals of the children who are being educated."

He continued, "Recent developments are resulting in another program being offered to this end. It includes organized, supervised play and recreation for the teaching of worthwhile, leisure time activities and the development of good habits for living the good life."

"It has become so successful that no longer can it be confined to the school child. Public need are demanding recreational opportunities for all."

HE MENTIONED THAT facilities in the new high school have been created with the following objectives:

- (1) To provide a place for satisfying enjoyable leisure activities for all people throughout the year.
- (2) To serve sport interests of individuals to afford new skills and interests.
- (3) To acquire a place for the physical and mental development of those who participate.
- (4) To contribute to the social enrichment of individuals.
- (5) To allow for the social enrichment of individuals.
- (6) To contribute to the spirit of unity, solidarity, and good-will in the community.

Whitney believes the new school will provide for such interest group activities as target, field and game archery; practice and tournament badminton; practice and tournament fencing; fly tying and casting; practice of golf fundamentals.

PRACTICE AND exhibitions of gymnastics; practice and tournament volleyball, practice and indoor meets for track and field; weight lifting, practice and tournament wrestling, rifle, practice and tournament basketball, roller skating, adult gymnasium classes, and others.

In addition outdoor facilities

will allow for seasonal sports, Whitney added.

The director also cited facilities for social interest groups which include indoor and outdoor dancing, dog training, practice and play productions, elementary drafts, nature study, banquets, festivals, community nights, story-telling, children's theater, lectures and adult music.

He also stated, "Arts and crafts interest which may be organized are classes in leather, silver, plastic, ceramics, wood working, model building, general shop, photography, sketching, weaving and hobby construction."

THE DIRECTOR explained, continuity of designs in the construction of the school allows for adequate parking spaces, separate control of special interest units, communication system, efficient lighting, ample toilets and night showers, fountains, locker and shower facilities, special storage, public telephone service, fire and alarm control, emergency first aid stations, spectator seats, restrooms and the conversion and multiple use of gymnasium.

He concluded, "The wise school coordinator of activities will see how possibilities are unlimited. A new area of living has opened to the citizens of our school district at very little extra cost."

The director said that there is now some misunderstanding on the present use of the school. He pointed out that some individuals and organizations have requested permission to use athletic facilities and other parts of the school.

However, much of the school including the gymnasium is still not completed, he emphasized, and no such activities are planned until facilities are ready.
