Deadline For Registration

Unregistered voters in the Birmingham school district who plan on voting in the special school district election March 31 must register with either the city or township clerk on or before March 21. Supt. of Schools Dwight B. Ireland emphasized this week.

This special election has been called to determine whether school electors will authorize the board of education to continue three and one-half mills of school tax for another five-year period to meet current operating costs of local schools.

A special levy has been granted for this purpose for the past ten years. This levy has expired and school electors are being urged by the school board to authorize the continuation of this levy for the next five years.

"THE BUDGET for next year depends upon this election," Ireland declared. "Teachers' contracts cannot be granted until the members of the Board of Education are assured that sufficient tax money will be on hand to meet their budget requirements for 1952-53."

"Since approximately 65 percent of the budget is allocated to teachers salaries, and since approximately 80 percent of the budget is devoted to salaries if custodians, clerk, administrative and staff officers are included, it would be impossible to enter into contracts for these services unless the operating levy were continued."

He added that all other items of the operating budget are included in cost in keeping with the market of today.

Fuel, textbooks, maintenance supplies, and every other operating cost continues to make a heavier demand upon the budget," he said.

"ELECTORS ARE URGED to study this problem and lend their support to the schools. Members of the Board of Education and myself have appeared before approximately 3000 PTA members and are scheduled in every school district to explain the need for the continuation of this levy and to answer questions from the floor."

"The need has been clearly stated in the press and the active cooperation of members of the PTA, the League of Women Voters, and other local groups is solicited to make the issue clear to every interested school elector."
