BARNES, who makes his home on Randall Court, Birmingham, is rated as a specialist on political news, and is one of the leading news commentators in the state. He has been with the Detroit News since before his graduation from the University of Michigan in 1920. He was transferred to Paris in 1925, and for six years covered Europe for his paper. In 1934 Barnes served as Washington correspondent.

During the war he was attached to the Office of War Information, first in New York and then abroad where one of his posts was head of press arrangements for the Cairo and Tehran conferences. In 1944 Barnes was appointed director of Psychological Warfare for the Mediterranean area, while continuing as head of O.W.I. activities.

He commanded some 4,000 French, Italian and British civilian and military personnel in this phase of the war. On his return to Washington in 1945 Barnes was awarded the War Department Exceptional Civilian Service Emblem.

League of Women Voters Backs Mill School Tax

Wholehearted support of the Board of Education's request for a 3.5 mill school tax was given by the Birmingham LWV at its annual meeting Monday at the Community House.

"This special tax levy is an absolute necessity if the quality of educational service in Birmingham schools is to be maintained," declared Mrs. Brooks Marshall, president of the League.

"After a careful study of our schools, the LWV has come to the conclusion that it is impossible to operate our present schools on what is allowed us out of the 15 mill limitation even on increased valuation.

"The 3.5 mill tax is to replace the 5 mills which expired in December, 1951. Actually, it is less than what the taxpayers have been paying for the past 5 years. We urge the people of Birmingham to vote for this 3.5 mill tax on March 31 when they go to the polls."

"IN THE STUDY of Birmingham schools prepared by the League, it was noted that local school population has grown rapidly and there is every indication enrollment will accelerate even more during the next few years (pre-school census in 1951 was 22,631).
