GREAT LAKES, Ill.—Along with other crewmen serving aboard the heavy cruiser USS Toledo, Raymond Slizewski, fire controller, first class, USN, age 40, and Mr. and Mrs. John I. Slizewski of 1340 Lamb rd., Troy Township, recently participated in the largest Pacific Fleet training exercises held since the Korean outbreak. The exercises, called "Laker Baker One," took place off the coast of Southern California, over 70 ships and 15,000 men of the Navy and the newly activated 3rd Marines participated.
