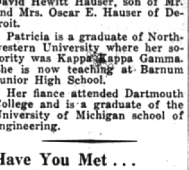
Mrs. Forsythe explains her aims as two-fold. She encourages art in the home by loaning pictures to individuals and acts as an agent for the artist.

A touch of spring, in the form of lilies of the valley centered with a white orchid, was carried by Joanne Sexton when she met Walker Morris Bagby at the altar.



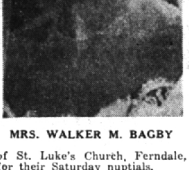
