## School District to Vote Monday on Special 31/2-Mill Levy

## School Operation Would Be Seriously Affected If Special Levy Doesn't Pass

For the third time in 10 years, the Birmingham board of education has come before residents of the school district to ask permission to levy extra tax millage in order to effectively operate the local school system.

Back in May 1942 and again in May 1947 the voters agreed to this request and approved a special 5-mill levy. The 1947 levy expired last December. Next Monday, March 31, voters will be in the election booths marking their ballots regarding this third request, which this time is for a 3½-mill levy.

BOTH THE TWO PREVIOUS requests were necessary because the Birmingham school board could not pay its teachers the salaries they were entitled to, nor buy the necessary textbooks, teaching supplies, the necessary utilities like light and fuel, with only that portion of the 15-mill tax limitation left the school board after the county and township governments got through taking what they wanted first.

The situation has not changed much during these past 10 years. To be sure, there has been great building activity in the school district, and thus valuations have increased. But the school population has been growing as rapidly, too. The school board also must meet the increased cost of es the same as any individual or private business.

FOR ITS NEXT YEAR'S operation, the board of edu-cation figures it will need slightly over 12 mills of tax per \$1,000 of equalized valuation to operate its schools com-fortably, but not extravagantly.

The Oakland county tax allocation board is extremely unlikely to give the Birmingham district more than 9 of these mills, possibly less. The other millage must come from the electorate through the renewal of the special mill

If this is not approved next Monday, the board will have the problem of trimming its budget something like 25 per cent. This cannot be done without disastrously endangering the quality of education supplied the children in this school

The Birmingham Eccentric recommends that the elec-torate next Monday, March 31, approve the 3½-mill special levy. Please remember that this 3½-mill levy is, in part, continuing the last 5-mill levy which expired last December.
