one, when 1544 voters supported it against 324 negative votes.
Mrs. Irene Stevens, clerk of the board, said Tuesday that 1947's registration of about 2600 would be topped this year.
"Although registration closed Friday," she said, "we have not yet had time to compute the exact number. However, it will be a far greater registration than any previous school election, regular or special."
"THE REGISTRATION of the schools within the city has been high, but those schools in the district but outside the city limits have surprised me."
The Bloomfield Village registration and Southfield (which includes Franklin, is far higher than I had expected. Of course we cannot even guess what the vote will be, but we can be sure that this question has created a wider interest than anything before it."
Ireland disclosed that members of the Birmingham P.T.A. Council Monday night expressed their approval of the levy and pledged support for it.
He said, too, that members of the League of Women Voters would thoroughly cover the school district this weekend, using a poster campaign to urge voters to support the levy for the future benefits of their school system.

APPROVED PRECINCTS, according to Mrs. Stevens, are:
Precinct 1, Adams school—those residents of the district, east of Woodward avenue.
Precinct 2, Quarton school—west of Woodward, north of Maple; west of River Rouge (below Manly), north of the Birmingham golf club, and east of Cranbrook and Covington roads.
Precinct 3, Barnum school—west of Woodward, south of Maple, east of River Rouge and north of Lincoln.
Precinct 4, Pierce school—west of Woodward and north of Lincoln, including Beverly Hills (former Southfield No. 3) and Southfield No. 1 districts.
Precinct 5, Franklin school—those residents in the former Franklin school district.
Precinct 6, Bloomfield Village school—residents of Bloomfield Village west of Cranbrook (below the former Bloomfield district 5).
Precinct 7, Walnut Lake school—residents of the former Walnut Lake district.
Polls will be open in these precincts from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.
