

# Belgian Student Is 'Foster Son' Of Village Family

A Bloomfield Village family, Mr. and Mrs. R. J. Eggert, 2664 Ambrly, have "adopted" Jean Claude Salmon, 15 year old Belgian boy. Jean's father, a former school teacher, was a Belgian army reserve officer who was captured by the Nazis after his first battle and spent a year and a half in prison. Following this he returned to teaching at Libramont school and began working with the Belgian underground. Betrayed by less patriotic neighbors, he was again taken prisoner and died in a camp on the Danube.

JEAN HAS a brother and sister and all three children are brilliant students. Jean is attending the second grade of the high school for juniors. It is his desire to study languages and, like his father, become a teacher. Mr. and Mrs. Eggert will contribute monthly toward the boy's support, enabling him to remain in school and continue his work toward his future goal.
