Officers heard lectures on fingerprint work and its importance in solving crimes as well as for identification purposes.

THE LOCAL school, the 18th and final session in a state-wide program, was to bring in-training information to police officers without depleting ranks while men attended regular police schools.

"It's the only way we can make the training available to every man in the department," he said.
