Discuss Sewage Problems With State Officials

City of Birmingham sewage disposal problems were discussed in Lansing last week Wednesday between City Manager Donald Egbert and officials of the state department of health and water resources commission.

Egbert stated, "They were advised of our present plans for providing more adequate sewage treatment. Both agencies are well informed regarding our situation and are in agreement as to our projected plans."

The city now is securing legal opinion as to the steps required in joining the Southeastern county sewage disposal authority. In addition, the city is following the Rouge Valley sewage disposal program.

Harabedian's Request For Zoning Revision Rejected by Plan Board

Plan board members will recommend that city commissioners deny the petition of Mike Harabedian that he be permitted to build a gas station or store on his property at the corner of Coolidge and East Maple.

Harabedian claims the land no longer is valuable as a homestead because of the industrial growth of Troy township areas across the street.

Several area residents protested Harabedian's plan saying he was proposing to further the type of development which he claimed had decreased the value of his two lots. They pointed out that the industrial development had already started in the township section when he made his purchase about five years ago.

A petition circulated among residents showed 90 per cent were against Harabedian's construction proposal.

Back in States Following Duty On Hospital Ship

GREAT LAKES III—Norton D. Redwood, machinist on a third class, USN, son of Mr. and Mrs. David B. Redwood, 18476 Quentin drive, Southfield township, recently returned to the United States while a young man aboard the hospital ship USS Repose.

The vessel is known as the "Angel of the Orient" for its treatment of 11,000 soldiers with only 33 deaths. The Repose, a 15,000-ton floating hospital with 800 beds, has spent the past 16 months in Korea near the front lines within easy reach of battle casualties.

In one action near Chinnampo, Korea, the Repose inched its way through 30 miles of dangerously shallow channel to evacuate more than 750 wounded United Nations soldiers before they could be trapped in a gigantic communist offensive. This made it necessary for the crew to work around the clock for 60 hours in one of the great rescue operations of the war.
