TITILLATING TIPS FOR MARCH

DON'T be hasty in uncovering flower beds. DO start some annuals in the house about the 15th—cosmos, asters, snapdragon, zinnia, ageratum, nicotiana, etc. DON'T uncover boxwood and evergreen plants until a grey day at the end of the month. DO plant sweet peas as soon as possible.

ORCHID ROSES IMMEDIATELY
(or you won't get any)

DO give asparagus a dressing of 6-10-4; 4-12-4; or similar fertilizer. DO use Agrilite for starting seeds and tubers. DO trim out dead stuff from fruit trees. DON'T fail to paint tree wounds after pruning.
