Checking will continue from 9 a.m. to noon the first three Saturdays of May at several schools and the Monahan service station, Southfield and Maple.

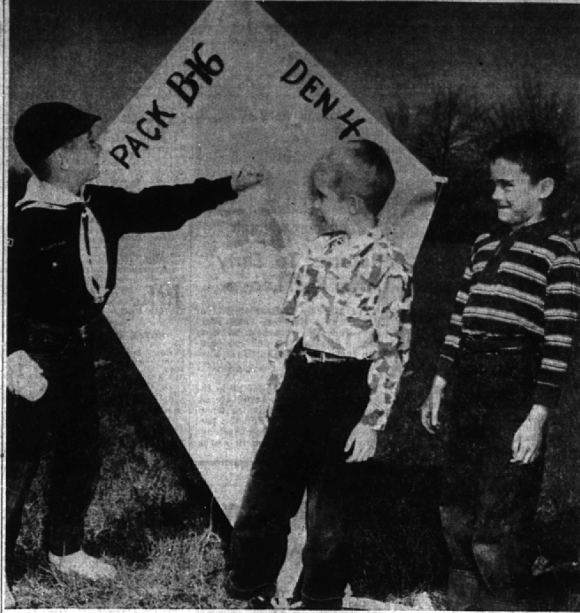

Red Cross Seeks Volunteer Workers As Welfare Aiders

Three questions are being put before Birmingham women by the Oakland county chapter of the American Red Cross. The questions are:

1. "Would you like to help a young serviceman's family who can't pay their rent?"

2. "Would you like to help a soldier to stay home a little longer and be with his wife when their child is born?"

3. "Would you like to help a sailor get medical care for his sick child?"

Mrs. J. C. Walker, chairman of Red Cross volunteer services, says the answer lies in serving as a Social Welfare aide.

"OUR PROGRAM—service at home to the servicemen in the field—urgently needs volunteers," Mrs. Walker points out. "It requires only 20 hours of training to become a full-fledged welfare aide."

"In helping the families of servicemen, the aide interviews them and directs them to the proper social agencies or helps them get a little money to carry them over particularly tight spots."

"We can arrange the training to suit the majority of the people who take it," she added. "We like welfare aides to serve only one day a week, but that also can be arranged to suit the volunteer."

"We sincerely hope a number of Birmingham women will contact the Red Cross office at Royal Oak or Pontiac for full information."

Tells Advantages Of Health Council For Community

Eugene H. Wiard, executive secretary of the Michigan Health Council, explained the program and purpose of its organization to members of the Birmingham Community Council at their meeting Thursday noon at the Community House.

Objective of the Michigan Health Council, he said, is to offer assistance and guidance in forming community health councils which join lay and professional groups in determining ways and means of helping all people on a community level in health protection.

In the formation of a community health council, all the facilities, knowledge and technical assistance of the Michigan Health Council is provided freely, he said.

OAKLAND COUNTY does not have a health council, he stated, but there are 87 counties in the state which do. Such community health councils, who keep in mind the total aspect of the health problem for all the people in the community, are alert to the changing health factors in their community and are making use of all available services provided by the state and other state organizations, he explained.

Action toward the solving of any kind of health problem is then one of concerted and united effort, he added.

Birmingham To Get \$36,223.12 of Tax

Oakland County will receive \$990,469.66 as its share of the first quarter of 1952 gas and motor vehicle fund, according to Highway Commissioner Charles M. Ziegler. Under the city allocations Birmingham will receive \$36,223.12 and Bloomfield Hills will get \$7,350.49.

Net receipts for the first quarter totaled \$54,473,410.40. Of this amount 44 per cent is sent to the state highway department, 37 per cent to the counties and 19 per cent to cities and incorporated villages.
