GOC Urgently Needs Volunteer Air Observers

"We are desperately in need of many more volunteers," Richard Dewey, head of Birmingham's Ground Observers Corps, emphasized this week.

Dewey said Michigan was one of 27 states which on May 17, has been ordered to start a 24-hour GOC program until further notice.

Gen. Benjamin W. Childs, commanding general of the Air Defense Command, said GOC crews were needed because of the failure to spot planes flying at extremely low altitude.

He pointed out that due to surface earth, radar is not as effective at 5,000 feet or more, but that enemy planes could streak through the curtain with low flying.

Dewey and Chief Observer James Fitzsimons have about 70 GOC members now enrolled. They issue an urgent appeal for Birmingham residents to volunteer. In order that their personnel will be sufficient to establish watches of from two to four hours a week for each person.

Troy Discusses Police Protection

Troy township board members will meet in special meeting Monday night to determine the future of police protection in the township.

Various plans have been under study to improve traffic, protection and the board feels that must decide whether to enlarge the present staff and work through the Oakland county sheriff's department or create a police department of its own.

There is one full-time deputy, furnished by the township, on duty at the present with four part-time men who assist in road patrols at night.

THE TOWNSHIP had thought that by enlarging the staff to three full-time deputies and as many part time officers as would enable the patrol car to be manned by two men, the sheriff's office would approve sheriff's branch in the township hall.

The sheriff's department has asked for five deputies.

A three-man committee of Supervisor Norman Barnard, Clerk Clifford Truesdell and Justice W. Wesley Smith was appointed by the board Monday night to report on comparative costs of building a township police department and of adding the additional men for the sheriff's branch.

The awards are certificates of recognition by the University and carry no money value.
