

LWV Girds for Parade And Candidates' Rally

To Birmingham members of the League of Women Voters Monday means meeting. The May gathering of the group will take place at 1:30 p. m. at the Community House, with a full agenda on the docket.

Chief topic of conversation both on the platform and on the floor will be the recent National Convention of the LWV at Cincinnati. Those present heard presidential candidates Stassen, Warren, Kefauver, Harriman and Kerr participate in a forum sponsored by the League, NBC, and Life magazine. Paul Hoffman presented views of General Eisenhower. Candidates and their proxies answered questions raised by over 200,000 citizens at local LWV rallies. Summed up, the panel presentation was termed "Citizens' View of '52".

MONDAY'S MEETING will continue with a briefing on state issues by Charlotte Marshall and Barbara Van Dusen. Birmingham representatives at the State Council meeting on May 19. Discussed will be taxation, the reappointment question, and children's services.

The session will close with plans being made for the June 12 Torchlight Parade and Candidates' Rally.

To quote from the LWV Bulletin, "it will be the biggest torchlight parade and candidates' rally since grand-dad donned his best derby and marched down Main Street, carrying his torch in the Garfield-Hancock campaign."

THE VOTERS' SERVICE Committee has sent invitations to all the Republican and Democratic candidates running for office in the primary election of August 5. Martha Magruder's Parade Committee has scoured the barns of the county for horses, surrries and rare old autos to carry the candidates in the parade. Pat Brooks and Barbara Van Dusen, co-chairmen of the Community Co-operation committee, are urging local businesses and organizations to enter floats.
