**Ohioan to Address Academy Grads**

Laurence E. Schmeckebier, director of the Cleveland Institute of Art, will deliver the commencement address at Cranbrook Academy of Art Friday afternoon at 3 o'clock, when 27 graduate students receive degrees of master of fine arts or master of architecture.

A graduate of the University of Wisconsin 25 years ago, the young Cranbrook school opened and the Cranbrook Foundation was created, Dr. Schmeckebier subsequently studied art and art history in five French and German institutions and has since taught in as many in this country, including his alma mater.

**HE IS THE AUTHOR** of several books and many articles in his field. Currently he is advisory art editor of Encyclopedia Americana and has held numerous important offices in professional organizations.

Selections from among the graduates' work are included in the annual student show which opened Wednesday evening at Cranbrook Museum of Art.

At the conclusion of the show, July 13, a representative exhibit will circulate widely in the United States.
