prior to starting college classwork.

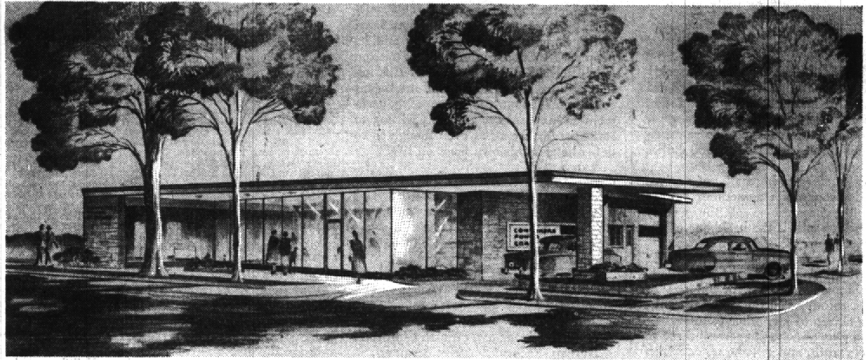
