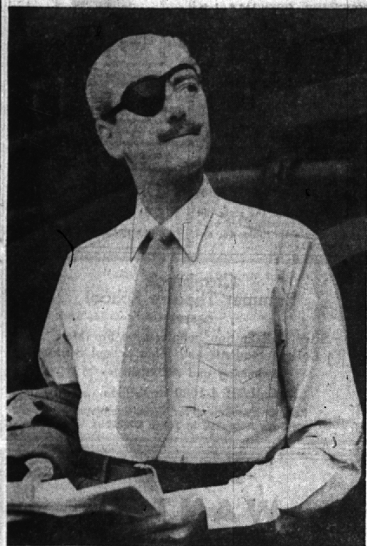

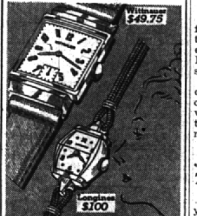
**High Twelve Club
Adjourns Meetings**

Dr. Frank B. Slutz, speaking Monday evening on "The Child's Bill of Rights" closed the final meeting of the season for the Birmingham High Twelve club. The group will reconvene until September. Dr. Slutz, basing his remarks on years of experience working with boys, said among other things they needed deeper understanding and more love and affection from their fathers. Too much of the duty of raising a family is left to the mothers of today, he declared. "Parents today are generally more concerned with what they expect of their children than what the children have a right to expect from them," he said.

"A CHILD'S Bill of Rights should include:
"Three reverences—reverence of person, reverence of law and reverence of responsibility.
"Three securities—economic security, affection security and character security.
"Answers to three questions—What shall my vocation be? What kind of home shall I have? What shall I believe.
"Recognition of three ages of growth—age of indoctrination, (birth through 12 years), age of developing personality (12 to 18) and age of 'solo' flight (18 to 24)."

**Attorney Recommends
Sounder Basis if City
Denies Rezoning Request**

Subdivision restrictions, preservation of property values or so-called "spot zoning" individually are not sufficiently strong reasons for denying a petition for rezoning, City Attorney Forbes S. Hascall told Birmingham city commissioners Monday night. Hascall's opinion came in connection with a review of the repeated petitions of Mike Harabedian and Mrs. Harabedian to erect a commercial building at East Maple and Coolidge. The city attorney pointed out that in his opinion, the petition should be given a further hearing inasmuch as one of these reasons should not be a sound basis for denial.

HE POINTED OUT the enforcement of subdivision restrictions, which may or may not exist, was not the city's business. He further stated that zoning should be "reasonable." The report was ordered placed on file until another report is received from the city plan board, which now holds Harabedian's petition and is scheduling an informal discussion of it soon.

**Juvenile Authorities
To Question Five Boys**

Five Birmingham boys, all 14 years old, will have a hearing soon before Oakland county juvenile authorities as the aftermath of an accident April 19 at Lincoln and Cranbrook roads. Police said the boys had taken a car, owned by the father of one of the group, without permission, adding that none held a license to drive. Two of the boys were seriously injured when the driver lost control of the car and rolled it over several times.

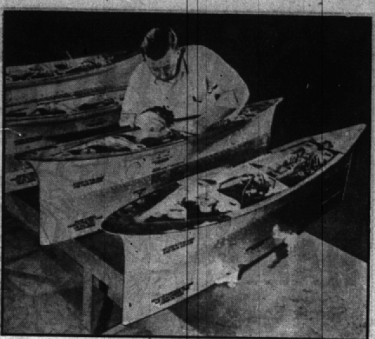
**Weekend Trip
