Board members took their action after residents in the area of the park complained about the nuisance created by park visitors.

WHEN PARYSTASH asked that the board reconsider his application for permit Monday night, residents again rose to complain of the dust, parking problem, and unruly behavior of the people the park attracted.

Troy Police Dept. Progress Is Noted

First step in the creation of Troy township's police department was taken Monday night as board members passed a resolution establishing the department.

Minimum qualifications of officers also were approved and the township instructed to start accepting applications for policemen.

The Pontiac police department has been asked to place Troy's police radio on their wave length.

Purchase of radio equipment is the next step to be taken. The board learned that a previous order to purchase radio equipment through the state civil defense office has been approved and the state is ready to take bids on the equipment.

TOWNSHIP OFFICIALS left for Lansing Wednesday in an attempt to amend their order requesting that the state allow them to use the equipment in both police cars and fire apparatus.

Supervisor Norman Barnard pointed out that purchasing the radios through the state would effect a 50 per cent saving to the township.

Township officials, who had all but forgotten the state offer to purchase the radio equipment with state aid, had decided to buy the radios themselves. They found that the cost of two mobil radios and a station set would cost them \$2,600.

Barnard said that the state aid would give the township the base set and four mobil radios for approximately \$1,700.
