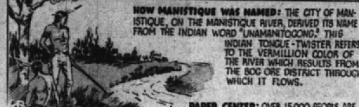
Top Soil Removal Faced With Fee

Southfield Holds Line On Liquor

No additional liquor licenses will be issued in Southfield township at this time.

In a stormy session that lasted only 20 minutes, board members voted four to three to refuse any of the six new licenses available in the township on the latest population figures.

The problem of what to do with liquor licenses that has vexed the board for two months was settled quickly but not without discussion Tuesday night among board members.

The liquor study committee of Glenn C. Hague, Margaret C. Bradbury and Thomas Langan who have studied returned questionnaires from the 18 license applicants, recommended that the township's initial approval go to licenses in two proposed large restaurants and the transfer of a resort C license to a full year license.

THE COMMITTEE qualified that these recommendations were only tentative needs of approval to the three applicants and final decisions would lie with the state liquor control commission and the neighborhoods near the proposed licenses that would be surveyed by the commission.

Supervisor William Roeser accepted the committee's report and moved that no further licenses be granted. After some discussion whether the motion was in order, the roll call vote was taken with Langan, Bradbury and Hague dissenting.

A second motion to permit the transfer of the class C resort license also failed with board members repeating their votes.

HAGUE FIRED BACK at Roeser by stating, "This is a mighty poor attitude for the township to take. I might add that it is a bigoted attitude. We have five straight bars in one area and the township needs a high class restaurant which is only financially solvent if proposed owners are allowed a liquor license."

Roeser, beset by criticism from committee members, brought further discussion to a halt by stating emphatically, "I do not believe that the future prosperity of the township is dependent on the issuing of more liquor licenses."

The township hall has been flooded with letters of protest and petitions against additional licenses from residents in the last two weeks.

Roeser pointed to the letters and said, "I sincerely believe that the people of Southfield are opposed to the granting of the licenses."

Previously, Hague stated that the letters and petitions represented a very small percentage of Southfield's 20,000 residents.

Man Arrested In Texas Wanted In Birmingham

Edward Raydenberg, wanted in Birmingham and other Michigan communities on charges of uttering and publishing, has been arrested in Wichita Falls, Tex., and is serving a 30-day sentence for vagrancy.

Police Chief Ralph W. Moxley learned from Texas authorities Wednesday morning that Raydenberg had refused extradition. Moxley said local authorities would start action to return Raydenberg to Michigan to face charges more than a year old.
