To Public**

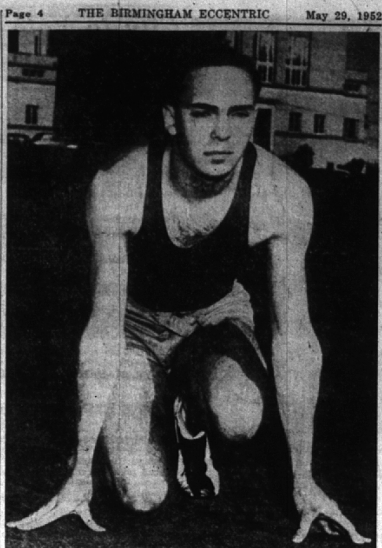
