Maple Tracksters Fall To Shamrocks

East Detroit's track team took a 4-1 1/5-47 4/5 decision from Birmingham at Pierce field last Tuesday, breaking up a close meet with a first and second in the broad jump and an 880 relay victory. This is the first time an East Detroit track team has ever defeated Birmingham.

The Maples' ace shotputter, Dave Bowen broke the school record on three consecutive heaves, his last and longest going 49 ft. 8 1/4 in. Other Maple firsts were Gordon Yates in the mile, Ned Sharples in the 440 yd. dash, Ed Hubbard in the 880 yd. run, Ken Fowler pole vault, and the medley relay team consisting of Bud Brown, Bud DeLoria, Jim Newman, and Don Jones.

Ed Sweeney and Ron Kramer starred for the Shamrocks. Each took two firsts, Sweeney in the 100 yd. dash and the broad jump, while Kramer took first in both the low and high hurdles.

Cranes Lose Meet To Royal Oakers

On Tuesday, May 20th, Royal Oak high school defeated Cranbrook in a dual track meet, 56 to 53. Bob Sharp of Royal Oak took first place in the 100 yard dash, 220 yard dash, the broad jump and ran a leg on the 880 yard relay to lead his team to victory with 16 points.

Grant Griswold of Cranbrook took first place in the 120 yard high hurdles with Parekka of Royal Oak second and Jim Studier of Cranbrook third. Cranbrook's Medley Relay Team composed of Bill Yaw, Charlie Cunningham, Ned Beardon, and John Yoyal won the relay with a time of 2 minutes 48.5 seconds.

Following Sharp in the 100 yard dash were Don Newey and Jon Thompson of Cranbrook. Bob Godfrey of Cranbrook took the 1 1/2 mile run with a time of 5 minutes 1.6 seconds. Christianstun and DeWascia of Royal Oak came in second and third. Dick Deskin of Cranbrook won the 440 yard dash by 54.4 seconds. Seniors of Royal Oak and Cunningham of Cranbrook came in second and third respectively.

In the 120 yard low hurdles Bill of Royal Oak took first place with a time of 18 seconds. Cranbrook's Yaw and Cunningham took second and third places. Ned Beardon and Bill Chase of Cranbrook placed second and third in the 220 yard dash. In the 880 yard run, Jones of Royal Oak took first place with a time of 2 minutes and 10.6 seconds.

Doug Richmond and Steve Welts of Cranbrook followed Jones in the field events. Rubel of Royal Oak won the shot put with a heave of 44 ft. 8 inches. Morrison of Royal Oak and Patton of Cranbrook were second and third.

In the high jump Jim Studier of Cranbrook placed first with a jump of 5 feet 4 inches. Parekka of Royal Oak took second place and Winters, Michigan and Parekka all of Royal Oak tied for third place. Charlie Cunningham of Cranbrook won the pole vault at 9 feet.

Friebel of Royal Oak took second place and Staples of Cranbrook and Michaels of Royal Oak tied for third place. Following Sharp in the broad jump was Charlie Cunningham of Cranbrook. Dick Deskin and Bob Reed of Royal Oak and Uhlmann of Cranbrook were second and third.

In the final event the 880 yard relay Royal Oak overcame Cranbrook's 20 points to win the event and the meet with a time of 4:03.
