Construction in City Remains at Low Level

Building construction in Birmingham continued below the 1951 level during the past month, as shown by the report of J. V. Walker, acting building inspector.

During the month 84 permits were issued for a construction program of \$495,015, as compared with 92 permits and \$748,755 in construction costs for the previous year.

Total construction figures for the first four months include 216 permits for buildings estimated at \$1,909,670. The same period last year had a total of \$2,943,290 for 285 permits.

Cadet Telfer is the son of Gilbert L. Telfer, 780 Greenwood Avenue, Birmingham.


