Keep Garbage Can In Plain Sight, Manager Warns

City Manager Donald C. Egbert this week asked the cooperation of residents in the location of garbage cans.

Egbert pointed out that all garbage cans must be in plain sight within 25 feet of the back or side door.

"We have cases where cans are placed in garages or hidden from sight behind shrubbery plantings," Egbert said. "This means the men must take time to search the premises to locate the can. Of course this slows collections."

"THE MEN have been told to tag such cans the first time. If the can remains 'hidden,' collections at that residence will be discontinued until the can is relocated in the proper spot."

"We have a new crew handling garbage collections now, and they are doing an excellent job. In the past several weeks only eight complaints have been received at the city hall—and that is a record."

Egbert said about 4,500 families are now being serviced by the Birmingham crew.

Management Meets To Set Dedication For YMCA Building

The Birmingham YMCA Committee of Management will meet Monday evening to complete plans for raising the balance of the money on the Nagoya, Japan, project for 'Y' World Services, to make final preparations for completing and furnishing the 'Y' temporary building, and to set a dedication date.
