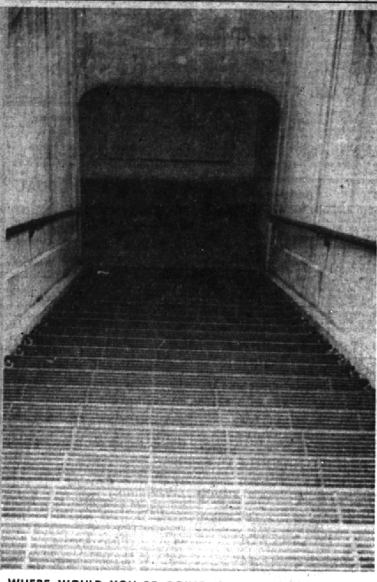

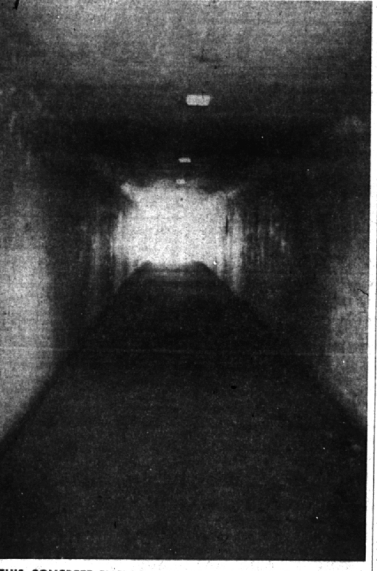

R. G. Hoover, 68, of 1220 South Bates, died Sunday in Henry Ford hospital, Detroit, after suffering a heart attack at his home.

Born in Asheboro, N. C., on June 4, 1883, Mr. Hoover was president of the R. G. Hoover construction company of Detroit. During the past 17 years his company has built more than 1,000 homes in the Detroit-Birmingham area.

He was a member of the Birmingham Realty board, Exchange club, Chamber of Commerce and the Builders Association of Metropolitan Detroit.

HE MARRIED the former Anna Otto Brunton in Detroit on Aug. 21, 1944, who survives.

Other survivors include his son, Raleigh G. Hoover and two granddaughters of Birmingham, and four sisters and brothers, Miss Minnie Hoover, Mrs. Sue Westall and Claude Hoover of Asheboro, and Carl Hoover of Washington, D. C.

Services were held Wednesday afternoon from the Manley Bailly funeral home with burial in White Chapel cemetery. The Rev. W. Glen Harris of the First Presbyterian church officiated.

REGINALD DAVIES, 48, of 384 Kennewick, died May 1 at his residence following a short illness.

He was born in Cheltenham, Eng., on Aug. 10, 1903, and had lived in Birmingham for 10 years, coming here from Sandusky, Mich. An employee of the Detroit Edison company for 28 years, he was assistant supervisor of overhead lines in this district.

He was a graduate of Cass Technical high school of Detroit and was a member of Carter lodge, F. & A. M., 393, Sandusky and the First Presbyterian church of Birmingham.
