The final meeting of the Adams PTA for this school-year has been scheduled for eight o'clock Monday night, May 12, at the school.

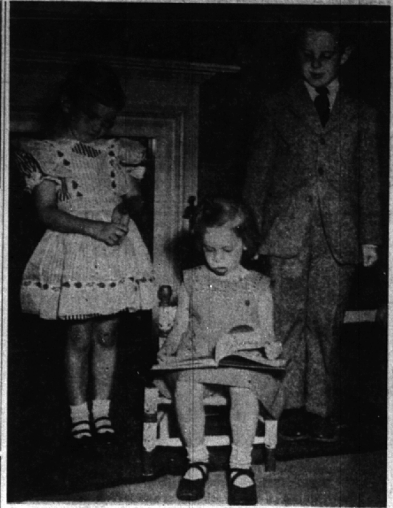
The color-film "God of Creation", one of the Sermons in Science produced by Dr. Irwin A. Moon of the Moody Institute of Science, will be shown.
