Approve Necessity Of Resurfacing On Three Streets

The city commission Monday night approved the necessity of resurfacing Hawthorne from Maple to Linden, Aspen from Maple to Hawthorne and Linden from Maple to Hawthorne.

The commission rejected the necessity of constructing a 24-foot concrete pavement on Brandon between Linden and Shirley.

After lengthy consideration was given the Brandon improvement, Commissioner L. A. C. Minor stated that he would bring in a resolution to vacate the street at next Monday's commission meeting.

ENTRANCES on the streets on Maple will be widened by the city. The Birmingham Park Improvement Association petitioned the city to stand the costs of the wider entrances and that the replacement of the gravel roadway on two sides of the triangle at the Linden-Hawthorne intersection with six-inch concrete be left at a width which would enable the parking of cars on the curves.

The association rejected the Brandon improvement "primarily because it would greatly increase through traffic."

DR. TENNYSON GUYER

Ohioan to Speak At Commencement

Reported to be one of the most currently popular speakers in the United States today, Dr. Tennyson Guyer of Findlay, Ohio, has been chosen as the Birmingham high school commencement speaker for the June 19 program.

Dr. Guyer will speak on "That's the Spirit," when he addresses the first Birmingham class to be graduated from the new high school.

Son of a former president of Findlay college, Dr. Guyer has, according to a brief sketch of him by Mrs. Guyer, "grabbed three doctor's degrees, written two books, spoken as many as five times in one day and 400 times in one year."

The 38-year-old radio speaker has spoken before more than 400 commencement groups in Chicago, after an appearance there, his program was described as "a truly American brand of oratory as real as the measles and home-spun as Mother's apple pie—most times Will Rogers have we heard such a speaker!"

HIS LONG list of engagements includes radio and television programs, conventions, churches, service and business clubs, lunquets, lodges, picnics and commencements for colleges and schools and many others.

In speaking of Dr. Guyer's appearance in Birmingham, Dr. Dwight B. Ireland, school superintendent said, "We are most fortunate to get this brilliant young speaker. His youth will appeal to the graduates and his character and manner will appeal to everyone."

City To Vote On Charter Amendment

Birmingham residents may be asked to vote on a city charter amendment in the state primary election on May 19.

The city commission Monday night instructed Claude Stevens, attorney for the city, to prepare an amendment to the Oakland County Ordinance No. 1987 enabling the city to become a member of the disposal district.

This will also necessitate the amending of a city charter which can only be done by a vote of the people.

COMMISSIONER Ralph A. Main stated, "If we follow Stevens' suggestions to the letter, this project will be carried out smoothly."

Only the east side of the city will be affected if the city joins the district. The city's sewage from this section would then be carried through the SOC system to be finally treated in Detroit.

The need charter amendment would conform to state law in regard to contracts between municipalities for sewage disposal service and drainage facilities.

Traffic Law Group Discusses Better Enforcement Aids

State traffic law enforcement officers, at a seminar held recently in Lansing, recommended that Michigan return to the two-plate system for car licenses according to Police Chief Ralph Moxley.

Moxley, City Engineer L. R. Gray and Oscar Gusterson, traffic engineer from Detroit who is consultant on Birmingham traffic problems, attended the session.

Moxley said it was pointed out that a car carrying the license on both the front and rear is much easier to spot than those with only the rear plate.

HE SAID the group also favored chemical tests for drunk drivers accepted as law enforcement.

"In most court cases it is a question of the officer's word against that of the driver, when the charges are drunk driving," Moxley said. "We seldom have witnesses and even when we do, they are often reluctant to testify."

He said that the session also strongly recommended prohibiting angle parking in locations where it is necessary to back into the main roadway.
