Christian Science Church Is Sponsoring Public Lecture Here on May 18

How Christianity can give higher aims and better health, and uplift modern civilization, will be brought out in a lecture on Christian Science to be given by Richard Knox Lee of London, England, in Birmingham, May 18.

Members of First Church of Christ, Scientist, sponsoring the lecture, have invited the public to attend without charge. Lee will speak in Baldwin School, Maple and Chester, at 4 p.m. His subject will be "Christian Science: The Way of Life Harmonious."

Now an extended lecture tour, Lee is a member of the Christian Science Board of Lecturers of The Mother Church and the First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Boston, Mass.

For many years active in education in England, the lecturer became a student of Christian Science after he was afflicted with an illness that had invalidated him from the British Army during World War I. He has been in public practice of Christian Science healing since 1929.

Japan Missionary To Speak Sunday At Christ Church

The Rev. John J. Lloyd, enroute to his home in Virginia after nearly five years of missionary work in Japan, will be the guest speaker at Christ Church Cranbrook at both the 9:30 and 11:15 services Sunday morning.

Mr. Lloyd, brother of Mrs. William H. Meade, was born in Japan where his parents were missionaries. He attended the Canadian academy there and later came to the United States to attend the University of Virginia, graduating in 1941. His theological education at the Virginia seminary, interrupted by service with the Marines during World War II, was completed in 1947, when he returned to Japan.

He has served since in Kyoto

and has held numerous offices in the diocese there as well as serving on the National Council of the Japanese Episcopal church. He will spend a year in the States, for further study, before returning to Japan again.

Mr. Lloyd will also speak at the May 13 luncheon meeting of the Woman's auxiliary of the church.
