Water Shortage Irks Southfield Area Residents

Southfield township is dry—too dry to suit some of its residents. Mackey and Arthur Green, representing 4,400 residents at Tuesday's town board meeting, reviewed water problems which they have had for the past 10 or 12 years.

"It was 10 years ago," Mackey pointed out, "that we began to appear before this board asking for better water service or restrictions on building. We've had promises but no action."

Mackey and Green, the latter serving on the water commission 11 years ago and currently a member from the board since 1950. The men stated that due to the seriousness of the situation, they felt compelled to take more drastic measures if help was not forthcoming from the board.

They pointed out that the Federal Housing Authority had stopped insuring mortgages on homes being built in the area because of the water shortage, and that the state board of health had been brought into the picture.

"What do you expect us to do?" Supervisor William Roesser asked.

Green and Mackey replied that they felt it was time for the township board to exercise its police powers which, they said, were broad enough to enforce denial of water permits on the basis of health standards.

They suggested that additional building permits be denied entirely, or be issued with the stipulation that no water rights will be available.

"We don't care how you do it, but we know something must be done to prohibit any more tapings into that main. The health hazard is bad enough in itself. Then, there is fire. We don't know what would happen should a serious fire break out, especially in the peak water demand periods."

The fact that the main along Eight Mile also is serving Detroit

was brought out as one of the bothersome phases of the question.

"THOSE PEOPLE sprinkle their lawns and use water for whatever purpose they fancy. As a result, we do not even have enough to maintain decent sanitation in our homes. Again we don't care how you do it, but you must do something to alleviate our needs."

Mackey said the City of Detroit had been asked to help and had offered no satisfactory solution to the problem.

"We have been getting nothing but lip service," he charged, "and we are no longer satisfied with lip service."

Roesser told the complainants that the board, just a few months before, had signed the articles of agreement between the township and the Southeastern Oakland County Water Authority, which would provide some help to the problem.

The trouble here, he said, was that little help could be expected during the coming summer. The board promised that, insofar as it was able, further building would be subjected to greater control.

Roesser, stating he doubted the legality of stopping permits, said he felt the only recourse was to tell applicants that a survey could be issued, but they would have to look elsewhere for their water supply, including the possibility of digging private wells.

IMMEDIATELY AFTER this hearing, Paul H. Dipman, representing the Bonnie Acres subdivision water commission, presented their demand for help.

"We have appeared before this body several times," Dipman said, "asking for more water. We can't ask politely much longer."

"Last summer there were cases where families did not have water to bathe their children—no, not even enough water for safe drinking. Faucets would be turned on and all you'd get was the suction sound from the pipes—no water."

"It doesn't look as though conditions will improve a bit. We've expressed our willingness to go along with the board in drilling a well. We're promised to pay the cost of a dry hole if an unsuccessful drilling is made. What more can we do?"
