B'ham To Attack Pollution Problem On City Basis

Birmingham commissioners Monday night decided that solution of the city's sewage disposal problems should be considered prior to entering a joint program with any other communities.

City Manager Donald C. Egbert recommended that bonding attorney Claude Stevens be employed by Birmingham to report on the methods available for joint action in meeting the disposal demands of the state's Water Resources Commission. The commission denied this method.

The state commission has ordered that Birmingham Hills and the township report on methods they intend to use to prevent further pollution of the Rouge River.

BOTH THE TOWNSHIP AND Birmingham Hills displayed a possible desire to enter into joint action with Birmingham at a meeting held between the interested parties in October.

But Birmingham commissioners agreed that figures about first be in improving its disposal system before further negotiations be undertaken with either the township or Birmingham Hills.

Commissioner Lance C. Minor asked for a report from the city's engineering consultants Lewis Ayres, Norris and May based on studies the engineering firm has been making in the city on the problem.

"I thought we were going to take care of Birmingham's problem and then consider whether or not to let other communities join into the city's disposal system," Minor stated.

Commissioner Ralph A. Main answered Minor by saying that the problem lies Birmingham to the township, and Birmingham Hills by

the number of illegal drains already existing using the city's plant.

"This looks like an attempt to solve a common problem where Birmingham's plant is on the lower end of the area. This solution seems the more economical way," Minor countered.

Minor argued that this might be the same as the school tax situation.

"School taxes are three times higher now than they were when the school district only included the city," Minor reminded. "Would we find that happening on this disposal problem?"

City Manager Donald C. Egbert reported that Southfield township also had received an order from the Water Resources Commission to ease its own pollution problem and added that some portion of the township might also ask to be joined to Birmingham's plant.

DETERMINATION on how each community is to solve the problem must be in the hands of the state commission by May 1, 1953. If the solution is by joint action no time limit has been placed on the submission of plans to the state. If the individual community is to take separate action, its plans must be submitted by August 1, 1953.

City Manager Donald C. Egbert said that a general engineering report might be secured from the commission within 30 days. Minor charged that the city's disposal system is already overburdened by the addition of the other drains and asked that the city proceed on the problem to secure costs for only city treatment before inviting other communities to take part.
