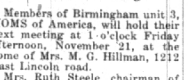
Alpha Phi Meeting

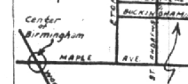

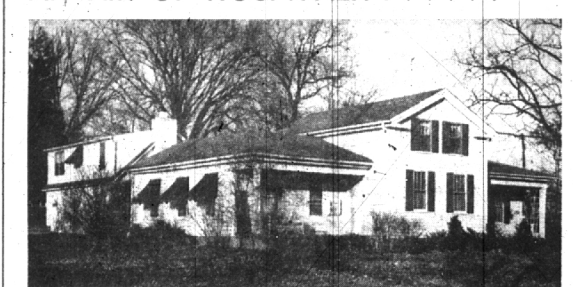
