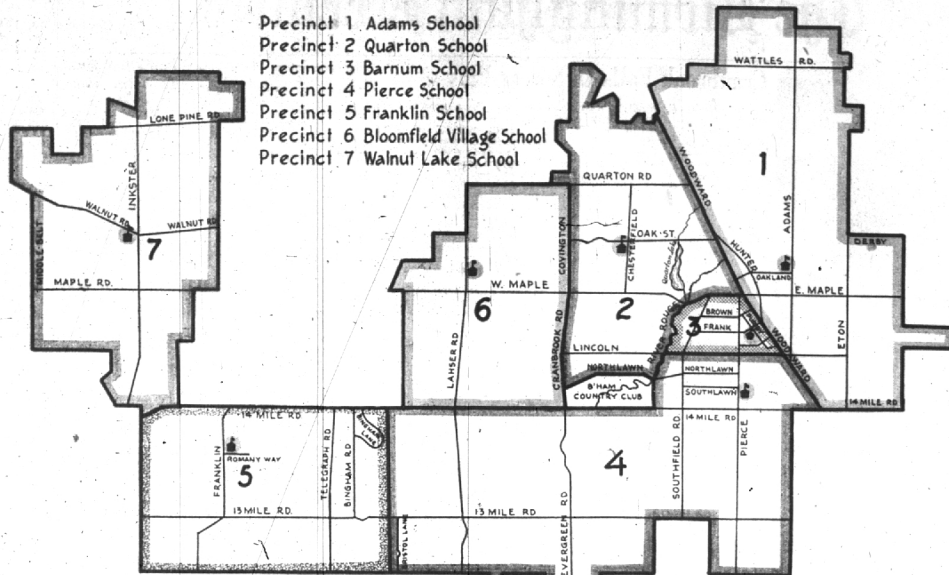

Where, to Vote in the Special Nov. 17 B'ham School Dist. Election

- Precinct No. 1—**
If you live in the school district and east of Woodward Avenue, you will vote at Adams School.
- Precinct No. 2—**
If you live in the school district west of Woodward, north of Maple, west of the River Rouge, north of the Birmingham Golf Club, and east of Cranbrook and Covington Roads, you will vote at Quanton School.
- Precinct No. 3—**
If you live in the school district west of Woodward, south of Maple, east of the River Rouge, and north of Lincoln, you will vote at the Barnum School.
- Precinct No. 4—**
If you live in the school district west of Woodward and south of Lincoln,

you will vote at the Pierce School. (This includes Beverly Hills, the former Southfield No. 3, and Southfield No. 1 districts.)

Precinct No. 5—
If you live in the former Franklin District you will vote at the Franklin School.

Precinct No. 6—
If you live in Bloomfield Village west of Cranbrook Road (former Bloomfield District No. 5), you will vote at the Bloomfield Village School.

Precinct No. 7—
If you live in the former Walnut Lake District, you will vote at the Walnut Lake School.

Cranbrook Varsity Drops Country Day

The Cranbrook Lower School football squad finished their six game schedule with a hard fought 13-7 victory over Country Day School of Detroit last Thursday.

Cranbrook fell behind in the opening minutes of the game when Country Day took the kick off and drove down the field for the game's first score. The conversion was made and Country Day led 7-0.

The score remained unchanged until late in the third quarter when Dick Rosenbald, Cranbrook quarterback, completed a long pass to Ozzie Jacobson for the first Cranbrook score. The attempt for the extra point was stopped and Country Day still maintained a 7-6 lead.

Country Day then surged down the field and threatened the Cranbrook goal but strong defensive play by the Cranbrook line and backfield stopped this and one other offensive thrust within the ten yard line.

IN THE CLOSING minutes of the game, Cranbrook took possession of the ball deep in their own territory and drove down the field. Fullback Bob Waddell sparked the drive by gaining twenty-five yards through the Country Day line before being wrestled to the turf on the Country Day fifteen yard line. Quarterback Dick Rosenbald then looped a short pass into the waiting arms of Ed Love who carried the ball over for the second Cranbrook touchdown. Ed Waddell scored the extra point on a cross back putting Cranbrook ahead 12-7.

Cranbrook maintained the lead throughout the closing seconds and defeated a team who had defeated them 7-6 earlier in the season. Fullback Bob Waddell was a standout for Cranbrook during the entire contest. He carried the ball for consistent yardage through the Country Day line. Waddell's crushing tackles also inspired his teammates to twice stop Country Day from scoring within the Cranbrook ten yard line.

BY A SCORE of 31-10, the Holy Name School of Birmingham defeated the Lower School team Thursday, Oct. 30th. Holcomb of Holy Name scored the first two touchdowns for the winners. Ed Love of Cranbrook then scored on a short pass from the center of the line and a run of ten yards. The six pointer was immediately nullified when Baldwin scored for Holy Name for a half-time score of 16-7.

Love repeated his scoring of the first quarter but Cranbrook trailed again as O'Connor scored two more touchdowns for Holy Name in the remaining minutes of the game.

Cranbrook Midgets Advance In Play

Continuing a seven game winning streak, the Cranbrook Lower school Midget team defeated the Detroit Olympics last Sunday afternoon 11-0. Playing in the semi-finals of the Midget Championship of the Detroit Red Division the squad will try next week for the city title.

In the first half of last Sunday's game, Don Teyman scored three of Cranbrook's goals. The Olympic game was required to make 21 saves during the game as the Cranbrook continued to pile on the 'Crans with goals by Bruce McCaul, Jon Himmelhoch, Dale Fruman, Sigmond and George Linp.

On the preceding Sunday, Nov. 2, the Lower schoolers defeated the Detroit Trail Blazers at Cranbrook. Their three goals were scored by Ronald Otto. In all, the Cranbrook midgets took 22 shots at the Trail Blazers goal.

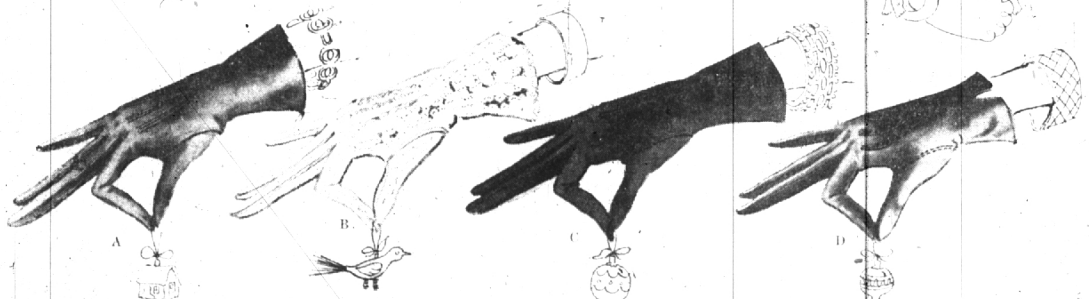

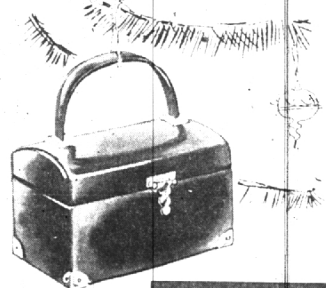
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
