Stokowski Directs Detroit Symphony Thursday Evening

Leopold Stokowski will be featured with the Detroit Symphony Orchestra in concert this evening at 8:30 p.m.

For his single appearance in the Masonic Auditorium, Stokowski has programmed Bach's "Tocatta and Fugue in D-Minor," Schubert's "Erlkne, ballet from "Romeo and Juliet," Wagner's "Wotan's Farewell and The Magic Fire Music from "Die Walkure," Avshalomov's "The Taking of Tung-Kuan," and Tchaikovsky's "Symphony No. 5 in E-Minor."

CONDUCTOR OF THE Philadelphia Orchestra, Stokowski has made a unique and lasting contribution in directly influencing the development of orchestral instrument playing in America, believing that the orchestral score is an outline of something to be created by the performer through his own creative powers.

His generations of pupils schooled by Stokowski hold the top positions in the best orchestras of this country. Through his movie appearances in pictures like "100 Men and a Girl," "The Great Broadway," "Carnegie Hall," and "Fantasia," Stokowski has brought great music to millions of people never before reached.
