## 'Romance of Furs' Enfold's At Oakland Hills Show Today



## AAUW Book Sale Ends With Report At Noon Meeting

The 25th annual AAUW Book Sale may be the thing of the past, but the Book Sale Board is meeting today for luncheon and "mop-up" operations at the home of Mrs. Charles Elmt, chairman.

Mrs. Ralph Beebe and Mrs. J. D. Fuller, co-chairmen of sales, planning to turn over their books today, have reported a gross receipt of close to \$146 for the 8941 books, 1311 magazines and countless miscellaneous articles sold. Expenses exceeded \$250.

Therefore, after leaving \$100 for next year's committee, some \$136 will be turned over to AAUW's treasurer for the organization to devote to scholarships, study grants and other educational projects.

In sending a check for \$448 to cover the charges on the 1787 books, 329 magazines, etc., that the schools and libraries of the area obtained when they were given first choice of the stock, an anonymous donor wrote "I feel very happy that you have enabled me to participate with you in supplying books to worthwhile institutions in our area."


