P. Hugh Herbert's rollicking comedy about a young girl who brings romance into the life of a middle aged actor provides an excellent vehicle for the talents of members of St. Dunstan's Guild in their current production of "For Love or Money" at the Cranbrook Pavilion.

"For Love or Money" follows the usual Hugh Herbert pattern of bright lines, interesting people to say them, mildly spicy but not objectionable situations, and well planned and effective curtains. Altogether they make up an enjoyable and relaxing evening, which was the consensus of the capacity audiences at Cranbrook Pavilion last week end.

Nancy Hintermeister and Maureen Blase have designed an attractive set for the performers, and Sheldon Noble and Dean Warner, as co-directors, have moved their people about in an interesting manner. They have been ably abetted by lighting by Charlie Gieg, make-up by Elinor Miller, properties by Peter Booth and Jean Beresford, sound effects by Tom Snellham, and set construction by Tom Martin.

TEE-ANN DOUGHTY brings a great amount of freshness and vivacity to the role of the young girl, and Fred Few successfully portrays the middle-aged but not aged actor. Supporting roles are well handled by Mary Proctor, Bill Saunders, John Knacht, Dottie Hutten, Gordon Saunders, and Janet Martin. 
