Edgar Guest Featured On Christmas Program

"An Old-Fashioned Christmas" will be the theme of the annual Christmas meeting of the Birmingham Women's Club at one o'clock Tuesday afternoon, December 2, at the Community House.

Heading the program will be Edgar Guest, beloved Free Press poet who will present "Memories in Poetry". Mr. Guest has been with the Free Press since 1895 and climbed to fame from office boy, cub and police reporter to columnist and writer of verse until his name and verses are well known in American home and family life.

Mr. Guest will follow the opening musical numbers on the program, presented by Estelle Marie Peralta, accompanied by Mrs. Aurelia Tonti Peralta.

The program will close with the Madrigal Singers, assisted by Theresa Way Merrill, presenting "A Christmas Story", a new song and dialogue setting of the Nativity which contains unaccompanied choral music in plainsong to contemporary style, arranged by Mary Jane Walker.

The Madrigal singers, now in their third season, have recently presented programs of traditional Elizabethan Madrigals, appearing in costumes which will be worn for this program.

Mrs. Walker, director of the group and best known to local audiences as a vocal soloist, studied choral conducting with Orville J. Howers, director of the music at Texas Christian University and Walter Aschenbrenner, late conductor of the Chicago Symphony

Choir, and has sung to the direction of Sir Thomas Beecham, Reginald Stewart, Max Krone, Noble Cain, Robert Shaw and others. Mrs. Merrill will be assisted in her narration by her two grandchildren.

MRS. E. S. SIKORSKI is chairman of the day. Mrs. Matthew Cammareri is program chairman, and Mrs. Edgar Ebersole heads the tea committee which will be assisted by the Junior Department of the Women's Club.

A costumed group from the Junior Department will usher.

The tea table will be laid with home-spun linen dating back to the Queen Ann period. Among those presiding will be Mrs. Paul Grant, president of the Women's Club, and Mrs. Allen Strom, head of the Juniors.

The one o'clock program, followed by tea, is open to all Women's Club members and their guests.

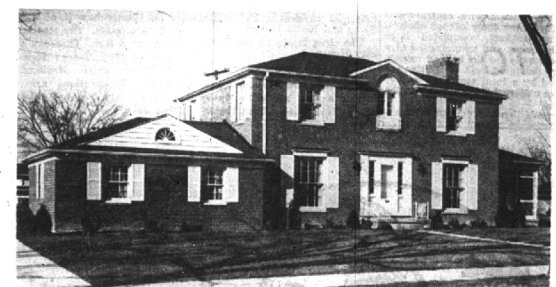
