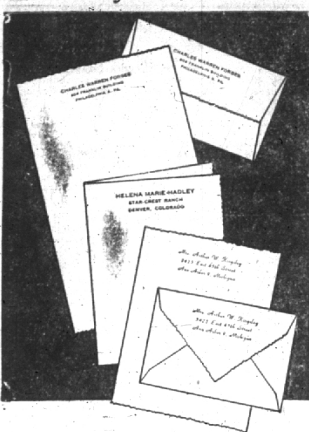

Maples Defeated By Port Huron

It was trick or treat night last Friday at Port Huron and the Big Red, celebrated by winning the seventeenth consecutive game, a 27-7 decision over Birmingham.

Port Huron's attack, one of the best in the state, was spear-headed by a pair of speedy halfbacks, Chuck Haseley and Frank Moeller and powered by husky fullback Al Davis.

Port Huron scored in the first minute of play when on the second play Gordon Mutch fumbled on his own 23. Haseley picked up nine yards on the next play and Moeller skirted end for 24 yards and a touchdown. Davis converted for the Big Red.

AFTER JOHN MONAGHAN returned the following kick-off 18 yards to the Port Huron 25 the Maple attack went into high gear and drove 71 yards to the Huron's 14 yard line where Don Dupuis fumbled and the Big Red took over.

From here the Port Huron attack drove to its own 36 where Davis punted to the Maple 30. The Maples were unable to get rolling again and Mutch finally punted to the Big Red 24.

The Port Huron machine drove 76 yards to score with Davis rushing up the touchdowns on a line converging to give Port Huron a 14-0 lead.

The half culminated with the Maples in possession of the ball on their own seven.

PORT HURON dominated the third quarter in which the Maples offense gained only five yards while Moeller and Davis each scored again. Moeller's score came on a 25 yard run. Davis made one of the extra points and the Big Red had a 27-0 lead.

Merrill Schlaack recovered a Port Huron fumble in the fourth quarter on the Maple 35 to give the Maroons a chance to drive for a score. Bob Appleford completed two passes to move the ball to the Huron's 31 and then tossed a long aerial to Bill Watkinson for the counter.

There was no further scoring and the game ended with the Big Red on the Birmingham 50 yard line.

The Port Huron offense was the strongest the Maples have met in two seasons. Halfbacks Moeller and Haseley had a combined rushing average of more than nine yards per carry, and Davis averaged six on power plays.

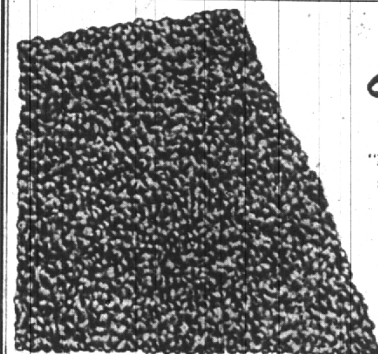
